# Fiscal Year's Budget

- Total allocation = \$2,572,903
- Salaries and Benefits (95%) = \$2,444,257
- Budget reduction of 13% (5% from base budget and Stimulus funds covered the remaining 8%)
- Tuition and fee increases will offset cuts



# Budget Reductions

---

How we have addressed 13% cuts in the COE:

- no faculty lay-offs
- used unfilled lines
- 5% cut to the base budget
- 8% from stimulus dollars
- No additional cuts expected in the fall
